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OUR COMMITMENT

As you may well be aware the school achieved outstanding GCSE results last year with 95.5% of our pupils gaining 5GCSE between A* - C. In 2014 - 2015 we hope to continue with our high standard with the support of pupils and parents.

- We have recently completed a Progress Report of each pupil in year 11. If your child is underachieving in three or more subjects he/she will be monitored by a member of the Senior Management Team in order to raise his/her current attainment level. You will automatically be informed if your child is under-achieving. A further Progress Report will be carried out in March, further monitoring your child's development in this crucial year.
- Homework / Revision / Coursework clubs are available for pupils to attend during lunchtime and after school. The library and study centre are open during the lunchtime and after school up to 4.30pm for pupils to complete work and have access to computer facilities.
- Homework will be given on a regular basis and should be noted in a pupils' Homework Diary. If homework is not completed, parents will be contacted via this diary. It is vital that pupils bring their diary to school each day.
- Attendance will be monitored and parents immediately informed of absences that give rise to concern. We would be grateful for your assistance by notifying us early of reasons for absence.
- Staff, supported by the Senior Management Team, will give of their very best in order to ensure that all pupils reach their full potential. We can not stress enough the importance of continued effort throughout this academic year. Coursework is key to your child's success and can often make a significant improvement to his/her final grading within a subject.
- Mock examinations will commence on December 10th and detailed reports highlighting pupils' progress and specific targets for improvement, will be issued in January.

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HOW PARENTS / GUARDIANS CAN HELP

Parental support is EIGHT TIMES more important in determining a child's academic success than social class, according to a new study. The Campaign for Learning found that parental involvement in a child's education can mean the difference between an A* and an 'also-ran' at GCSE.

(Times Educational Supplement, 10 October, 2003)

Many of the points listed below may seem obvious, but they do provide an useful overview of how you as parents or guardians can support your child during this extremely important and usually stressful period.

- Ensure a high level of attendance. Your child should attend school every day unless genuinely ill. Every day missed through absence means your son / daughter has six lessons of catch up to complete.
- If absenteeism can not be avoided, please ensure that lost work is completed. Seek help from heads of departments or from the head of year.
- Ensure that your child is fully equipped for all lessons, (including homework diary).
- Ensure that your child establishes a good homework routine. He/she should have access to a desk and a quiet place to study. As a guide pupils should spend 2 hours per evening and weekends on school work. Constant revision is essential if there are no homework or coursework tasks to be completed.
- You may wish to plan a programme of revision with your child. There is always a need for children to revise their year 10 work and summarize the notes given in class. They need to learn their work thoroughly and test themselves at regular intervals.
- Maintain close contact with the Head of Year, Subject Teachers and Form Tutors by using the Homework Diary on a weekly basis. Please don't hesitate to contact the school with any concerns you might have.
