## Shakespeare Study Day Shakespeare Birthplace Trust, Stratford-upon-Avon Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> October 2022

Dear Parent/ Guardian.

I write to inform you of an exciting opportunity for your son/daughter to be part of an exciting visit to the historical town of Stratford-upon-Avon, the birthplace of William Shakespeare **on Thursday, 27**<sup>th</sup> **October**. During the day, learners will have an opportunity to enjoy a guided tour of the birthplace in addition to lectures and workshops from experts on the play 'Macbeth' (the current text studied by year 9 learners).

Return transport to and from the birthplace will be provided, however due to travel times, we kindly ask if all learners could arrive at Bryn Tawe promptly by 7:30am to ensure we arrive in plenty of time. Learners will have some free time to shop and have lunch in the town centre during the day. We hope to return to Bryn Tawe by approximately 6:30pm (though we will encourage learners to update parents on the day). Learners do not require school uniform, however we would like to remind learners to wear appropriate clothing.

We ask kindly for a <u>contribution of £35</u> towards travel costs and this includes the guided tour and study day. In addition to this, learners can bring additional spending money should they wish to do so. Even though learners will have time for lunch in the town centre, they are also free to bring a packed lunch and snacks for the journey should they prefer to do so.

We kindly ask if you would be willing to complete the attached medical form, and return it with payment (cash or cheque made payable to Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Bryn Tawe) as soon as possible. There is space for 30 learners on this excursion, so we recommend confirming learners' places as soon as possible.
