Thank you to **year 9 parents** for supporting your child with choosing their options for their GCSEs. We will share the final columns early at the start of next term. It is good to note that a high percentage of pupils are able to study their 3 chosen options, with everyone able to choose at least 2 out of their first 3 choices. We will be conducting option interviews with pupils who cannot study all options, as well as those who would benefit from considering the most suitable options for them, early in the Summer term. Of course, we will involve you our parents and carers in this important process. Completing this process will allow us to **start GCSEs with year 9 pupils immediately after Whitsun half term on Monday 6th June.**

Thank you once again to our parents who ensure their child conforms to our expectations, which are key to standards of engagement, behaviour, effort and attitude towards pupils' learning.

- **Uniform**: We undoubtedly see a consistent link between personal uniform expectations with the progress, behaviour and contribution of learners at school. If you are unsure about our uniform and appearance expectations, see the details <u>here</u> on our website.
- **Mobile phones**: Your child needs to be able to focus in lessons in order to learn effectively and therefore turning off phones provides a great opportunity to avoid any distractions to learning.
